HERE IS WHAT I KNOW – THOUGHTS FROM THE WASCOE PRESIDENT

NASCOE continues to represent our working interests in Washington DC. It is because of our integrity and customer service that Zach Ducheneaux, FSA Administrator was able to secure the 6% retention incentive for 26 pay periods (for employees on board as of PP 12). NASCOE negotiations team secured medical and retirement benefits, and updates to our work software. Be sure to read the 2022 NASCOE Negotiation items posted on our home e-mail and on the WASCOE website. I encourage you to talk these benefits over with non-members. Keep informed by reading the general information on the NASCOE website and on the NASCOE APP.

Clint Bain and David McBryde, NASCOE Legislative Co-chairs, gave a short report during the recent shutdown call on September 26, 2023. The House agriculture committee did not recommend any budget cuts to the Farm Service Agency. This is a big win for NASCOE as other government agencies had their budgets decreased. The Senate is proposing a \$15.8 million increase in the FSA budget. Likely the resulting compromise will be somewhere in between. NASCOE is grateful for Congress and the Administration's acknowledgement of the agency's effort to serve the producers of this country.

So where does the FSA budget go? The following information was shared at the 2023 NASCOE convention in College Station, TX. The budget goes to: #1-Pay and salaries, #2-IT costs, #3-Rent (\$120 Million), #4-Operations (\$105 Million), \$16.2 million allocated for awards, and hoping for a 5.21% pay increase on January 1, 2024.

NASCOE has implemented a new APP to serve the membership with updated news and events. The APP was developed to give the organization a modern feel and a place to post sensitive information. General information will continue to be posted on the NASCOE website.

The request is forwarded to the Midwest Area Membership Chair - LeAnn Oltmanns, Illinois (leann.oltmanns@nascoe.org). LeAnn verifies your membership with Jon Beam, WASCOE treasurer. You will receive an e-mail from noreply@glueup.com with a link to register your account. You may download the APP to login or login from the NASCOE.org website. You will have to create your own name and password.

Dawna Hines, NASCOE Publicity Chair offered this suggestion - if you are unable to download the APP go to the NASCOE web page and click on "JOIN NASCOE". Follow the steps to add your contact information so your name is added to the workflow for membership verification.

Lastly, there will be an all-member call October 12, 2023, at 7:00 pm to vote on the secretary of state merger. Background: NASCOE had to update their business profile with the election of a new treasurer. NASCOE was registered in New York where a previous treasurer set up the business structure. Through the cutover from old to new treasurers, it was noted that doing business in New York state was more expensive than in South Dakota. New York will not release our business obligations until there is an all-member vote. Please attend the meeting to cast the vote to change the business profile from New York to South Dakota (this process is the secretary of state merger). NASCOE needs 100-members for a quorum. The WASCOE publicity chairs will notify WASCOE members of the voting details, time, and link to join the meeting.

Have you checked out the new items on the Emblems by Superior? There are some cute items to refresh your work wardrobe. Fifteen percent of the sales goes to the NASCOE scholarship fund. In 2022, \$64,000 was donated to the scholarship fund.

Treasury

There are not a whole lot of updates for the treasury since November. We have collected \$6016.28 in dues so far this year. Our quarterly dues to NASCOE have been \$5,000.00 through the 3rd Quarter. Just a reminder that \$55 of every member's dues goes to NASCOE. Our rates are one of the lowest around.

Our greatest expense so far this year was sending our delegates to the National Convention in Savannah, Georgia at a cost of \$2,630.56. We spent \$295.61 to provide lunch at several new employee orientation meetings while providing an overview of what WASCOE offers and the benefits of becoming a member.

WASCOE receives a stipend from NASCOE for delegates to the National Convention. The stipend is calculated by taking the cost of airfare from the state's capital city to the destination, multiplied by the state's amount of membership, multiplied by the number of delegates. Currently our membership is at 52%. The greater our membership, the more NASCOE helps to defray the cost with their stipend.

Coming up is our annual WASCOE convention on April 21, 2023 at the Metropolis Resort in Eau Claire. The cost of the convention is \$14 for lunch, \$23 for dinner, and if you register for both lunch and dinner, the total is \$30. Dillard Financial Services, Inc. will make a donation to WASCOE based on the number of attendees. The more attendees, the larger the donation! So, make your plans to attend!

Don't forget about our cash raffle! There are 250 tickets being sold at \$20 each. There are \$2,000 in prizes to be awarded. The prizes are: 1^{st} - \$1,000, 2^{nd} - \$500, 3^{rd} - \$250, 4^{th} - \$100, 5^{th} - \$50, and 7^{th} - \$50. The net income taken in helps with our general fund which is used for delegate and convention expenses, as well as general operating expenses.

Our website contained outdated information and some areas were incomplete. It took a weekend, but I cleaned it up by updating each page with current committee chairs, emails, applicable committee page links, and more. I put designed it with a more consistent look and format for each page so it would be familiar when browsing each page and where information may be located.
